Kindergarten



(Two 30-minute classes per week)

The kindergarten students began the fifth six weeks with a new story *Playful Puppies Perritos juguetones* which provided a lot of opportunities for acting and saying what puppies do. The students sang a song in Spanish about a dog named B-I-N-G-O, and with the use of a PowerPoint picture, they chatted about how the body of Bingo the dog is different from that of a child (paws *patas* or tail *cola*, etc.). In addition, the students learned to say and act out eight modes of transportation. They grew in their listening skills by following Total Physical Response commands about driving a car, and the song “The Little Yellow Bus Has a Puncture in its Tire” was fun to sing in Spanish. The students also sang the Spanish version of “The Eency Weency Spider” and recalled feeling words taught earlier in the year. They remembered that boys say “*Estoy enojado.*” but girls say “*Estoy enojada.*” when feeling angry. The fifth six weeks was busy for kindergarten students in Spanish class.
